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Major depression is a risk factor for suicide, accounting for up to 60% of suicides.(1-4) The literature has shown that a large proportion of patients who died by suicide had made contact with a primary care health provider within the three months preceding their deaths.(5-7) Patients who died by suicide were also more likely to visit their primary care practitioner than a psychiatrist. The assessment and management of suicide risk is conducted within a collaborative partnership between the relevant health services, the person at risk of suicide and their family. Suicide risk assessment generates a clinician rating of the risk that the person will attempt suicide in the

The National Strategy for Suicide Prevention (2012) has set a goal to reduce suicides by 20 % within 5 years. Suicide rates are higher in older adults compared to most other age groups, and the majority of suicide completers have visited their primary care physician in the year before suicide. Primary care providers (PCPs) play a crucial role caring for patients with depression, managing antidepressant therapy, and assessing patients for suicide risk. Ten percent of the more than 20 million primary care visits for depression each year involve mental health issues, and account for 62% of the antidepressants prescribed in the United States.
