Wabash Bottoms is an example of collaborative conservation: forty-five acres of the seventy-acre property belong to NICHES (marked with property boundary signs). The Wabash River, which runs through Tippecanoe County, is the second largest tributary to the Ohio River and is the longest segment of free flowing river east of the Mississippi River. The watershed has a total drainage of approximately 33,000 square miles and in 2010 had a population of around 4,366,000 people.

On January 27, 1836 was enacted into law the famous Internal Improvement Act. This act provided for an extension of the Wabash-Erie Canal from the mouth of the Tippecanoe River to Terre Haute, a distance of 104 miles, and the first section as far as Lafayette was completed July 4, 1843.
